We aim for every child to have attendance of 95% or above. Those who have achieved this this half term have been celebrated in assemblies this week. Well done to all. We will be continuing to celebrate attendance throughout the year.

It is important to consider how many days off and how this equates to their attendance percentage. Every child under 90% is seen as 'Persistently Absent' and interventions will be put in place for these students to support with their absences.




The ambassadors have already been busy this week getting our MFL Christmas tree decorated.
