NEWS FROM OUR FACULTIES

English

This half-term, Year 7 have started reading *The Fire Eaters* by David Almond. The novel follows 11-year-old Bobby as he navigates growing up during the Cuban Missile Crisis. Our Year 8 students have been reading William Shakespeare's *Much Ado About Nothing*. They have been examining Elizabethan attitudes towards marriage, and how women fared living in a patriarchal society. Our Year 9 students have also been studying a Shakespeare play, *Richard III*. They have been exploring the themes of primogeniture, power and duality.

Year 10 have been studying another one of their GCSE English Literature texts, *An Inspector Calls*. We have heard some fantastic debates in lessons regarding what is means to be a capitalist and a socialist. Well done Year 10!

A special well done to our Year 11 students who have completed their Spoken Language assessments this half-term. It has also been fantastic to see so many students joining our online revision sessions. Keep up the hard work!

Humanities

This term has seen the Humanities department focus relentlessly on preparing Year 11 for the upcoming pre-public examinations in February and, beyond that, for the GCSEs in June. Remote revision sessions for both History and Geography are in full swing and, to that end, may I take the opportunity to remind parents and carers that for History, they take place between 5.45 and 6.45 on Wednesdays, and for Geography between 4.30 and 5.30 on Thursdays. Attendance for both has been reasonably good so far, with over half of the entered students participating regularly, but we believe that it could and should be even better attended. The advantage of remote sessions is that students do not have to rely on being picked up having missed the bus. Neither do the sessions clash with any other subject under the current arrangement. I cannot stress enough just how crucial these sessions are in preparing students for the final examination and it is no coincidence that those who have attended regularly in previous years have been those that have really aced the final examinations. Both History and Geography have organised in person sessions during the February half term holidays at the school, as follows:

Geography-9-12-Monday 13th February

History-9-12-Tuesday 14th February

It goes without saying that we are, as ever, anxious that as many students as possible are able to attend.

Otherwise, teaching and learning have continued apace, with students facing their termly assessments in all three subjects after the February half term. As always, we are grateful for the support that you provide your children with during these times and hopefully this will enable students to thrive and demonstrate their best possible performance. Aside from this, I hope that all of you, parents and students alike, have a refreshing half term break and come back raring to attack another half term of successful learning in the Humanities.

We are eagerly preparing for the Maths Disney Trip taking place in March. Year 10 students are looking forward to visiting Paris and Disneyland. They will be applying their mathematical skills in

a variety of settings and engaging in a cultural experience in addition to experiencing the fun of Disney's theme parks.

Mrs Jacobsz has provided invaluable revision sessions covering key Grade 4 and 5 topics every Tuesday evening. Students have been engaged and look forward to this additional opportunity to revise mathematics.



Miss Colson is enjoying working with a small group of students aiming for a Grade 7 or above, having higher level mathematical discussions and working as a team to solve difficult problems involving a range of mathematical techniques. This groups of students have appreciated the opportunity to engage with the most challenging GCSE problems.

Small group after-school in person and form time intervention is beginning. These sessions provide additional support to those working incredibly hard but in need of greater direction to move across a grade boundary. Students recap key topic areas that frequently appear in GCSE papers and become more secure in the basics of number, algebra, ratio, geometry and statistics.


We are impressed with how focused the majority of Year 11 are in achieving their maths GCSE.

This half term Science have trialled setting homework on SENECA. Pupils need to create their own login and then input their class code to find the assignments. All class codes are up on the Science noticeboard.


